PLEASE NOTE that there are **two** steps to register your child(ren) at Meadowlark Christian School.

STEP 2. Complete & submit the MCS Registration form & required registration fee.

Once both of these steps are completed, your child is considered registered for the next school year and you will receive written confirmation of your registration and method of payment for your Alternative Program Fees.
